A weekend of chamber music with moving classics and authentic folk music:

A top Berlin ensemble and "woman power" come to Andermatt

Classical music fans can look forward to a special treat: the Philharmonic String Quartet Berlin, made up of members of the world-famous Berlin Philharmonic, is coming to Andermatt to present an evening of enchanting and melancholic melodies on 18 February. The next day, the four young women of "Eiger Mönch & UrSchwyz" present a mix of well-known and new folk music in Andermatt. A weekend of chamber music guaranteed to thrill both classical and folk music fans alike.

The Philharmonic String Quartet, consisting of musicians from the world-famous Berlin Philharmonic, present a moving concert featuring intensely beautiful and melancholic works – a soothing prospect for moments of sorrow. Samuel Barber's popular "Adagio for Strings" was voted "the saddest piece of all time" by BBC listeners. The piece, performed at the funerals of John F. Kennedy, Grace Kelly, and Albert Einstein, will now be heard in Andermatt against a breathtaking mountain backdrop. Concert-goers may also look forward to Felix Mendelssohn Bartholdy's String Quartet No. 6, composed by the Romantic composer from Berlin whilst in Interlaken and Leipzig. The work has an astoundingly forceful and highly expressive character, with capricious alternation between minor and major keys. The concert will also feature works by Fanny Hensel (Mendelssohn's sister) and Giacomo Puccini.

The second day of the chamber music weekend features the ensemble "Eiger Mönch & UrSchwyz" – four young women, four string instruments, and a few surprises. In Andermatt, they will present music from Switzerland and beyond, which in their own words translates as "local", "traditional", "quirky" and "modern" – old Muotathal and Appenzell dances together with new works by renowned composers such as Markus Flückiger, Dani Häusler, Fränggi Gehrig, and Noldi Alder. The group will also perform their own compositions as well as Nordic folk music works. Guest artists Fränggi Gehrig, Andermatt local hero and accordionist, and Dani Häusler, versatile folk musician and presenter from Unterägeri, round off the evening with new compositions of their own.

Top ensembles at Andermatt

These two string quartet ensembles couldn't be more different, but both represent outstanding quality in music. The special feature of the string quartet is that it actually "simulates" an entire orchestra, with the bass voice being taken up by a cello or contrabass rather than by a harpsichord or other keyboard instrument. And it would be inconceivable to imagine traditional folk music without the unmistakable sound of the contrabass.
